

Tips on Filming, Posting and Promoting Videos of Adoptable Pets



Filming:

- 1) You don't need a video camera! Many digital cameras and cell phones have the ability to take a short video.
- 2) Just like with photographs, make sure the pet is the focus of the video, rather than the background get in close at eye-level.
- 3) If you're filming indoors, choose a well-lit spot and avoid shooting directly in front of a bright window. If you're filming outside, be sure to keep the sun behind you.
- 4) Catch the pet playing with a toy, interacting with people or showing off a trick or good manners.
- 5) Let the video speak for itself or narrate with information about the pet.



Posting:

- 1) Limit your video to about 30 seconds or less to keep your viewer's attention and limit upload time.
- 2) Adding a video to Petfinder is easy. You can upload from your computer and/or camera or embed a clip from YouTube.
- 3) You can upload any commonly-used file type, such as MPG, AVI, MOV, MP4, RM, WMV, etc.
- 4) Because the video will show in a small window, use the average quality setting on your camera to limit the size of the file.
- 5) Uploads can take just a few seconds to several minutes, depending on your file size and Internet connection speed.



Promoting:

- 1) If your off-site adoption location has Internet access, set up a laptop to show off the pets you couldn't bring.
- 2) Alert everyone everywhere! Add a tagline to your email signature, business cards, volunteer t-shirts, etc., letting people know they can see adoptable pet videos on your Petfinder site.
- 3) Ask a volunteer to make special "adopt me" vests that say "Watch me in action! Go to Petfinder.com (or your unique Petfinder URL)."
- 4) Hold a contest! Ask volunteers to film your adoptable pets and have a contest to vote for the best video.
- 5) Talk to the press! Let local reporters, radio stations and newscasters know that they can find videos of your adoptable pets on Petfinder.com.
